Goodwill's commitment to engage community members in workforce development, quality-of-life services, and supports remained strong in 2022. In fact, the organization nearly doubled the number of people impacted by Goodwill through its programs and services with a record-setting total of 30,685 served. This surpasses a goal set in 2021 to serve 30,000 people annually by 2030. We have our sights set on serving 33,000 people in 2023.

In this new year, Goodwill of the Great Plains will celebrate 100 years as a member of the Goodwill movement. It's an honor to lead a mission-focused organization pioneered in the early 1900s, yet relevant today to job seekers and community members seeking opportunities to thrive. Founder, Edgar Helms believed in a "hand up, not a handout" when visioning a social enterprise model collecting household goods and turning them into job training and work opportunities to enrich the lives of others. Today, our local organization provides jobs for over 550 individuals earning competitive pay and benefits. Goodwill's collective work provides valuable resources to the communities we serve through job training programs and supports, Adult Day and Habilitation Services, Job Centers including a new mobile Career Cruiser, Retail Operations and GoodShred business services.

Looking ahead to the new year, two agency growth projects are in the works to add welcoming spaces for community engagement in Goodwill's mission to change lives. In 2024 the organization plans to open a new retail store located in Vermillion, SD. Adding convenience for local donors and shoppers, new jobs, and mission opportunities. A second project will bring a 21,000 sq foot mission facility, growing the Goodwill campus on Sioux City's westside with capacity for community-based services in a beautiful multi-use center including a gymnasium. On weekdays this new facility will support Goodwill's Adult Day and Day Habilitation Services, Job Center, meeting space and offices for staff. The community will be invited to visit the facility for events and functions such as the annual Goodwill Shoe Party, Career Fairs, and much more. It will be a true gem for the Siouxland community, planned to open by the start of 2025.

Supported by leadership from a local Board of Directors, Goodwill of the Great Plains is on a path of growth and elevated impact on the communities we serve. When community members trust our organization with donations of gently used household goods, opportunities to "do good" multiply tenfold. We are committed to advancing the work of Goodwill to build self-sufficiency through education and job training long into the future.





Secure Document Destruction

GoodShred invests in our community by offering Secure Document and Hard Drive Destruction and recycling thousands of pounds of paper each year to keep it out of landfills.

Goodwill believes in creating a world of dignity and compassion by helping people gain valuable job skills to find employment. The average collection container diverts 200 pounds of paper from landfills and provides two hours of job coaching for individuals in Goodwill programs.
